Through our Training, Education, and Consultation Services, we support allied providers around the state and country by providing opportunities to engage with one another (reducing isolation and burnout); delivering cutting edge webinars, case consultations, other trainings / consultations on culturally-responsive mental health practices; and building a workforce of representative, sustained professionals to elevate the mental health of Latino individuals in North Carolina and beyond.




